# Alumni provide \$365,425 "jumpstart" for 101 students

On May 21 the Salem High School Alumni Association broke its record for scholarship-giving when it awarded \$365,425 in scholarships to 101 students—58 graduating Salem High School seniors, 37 alumni who are enrolled in college and graduate school programs, and six current students, who received band camp scholarships.

Bob Hickey '50 was the featured speaker as the 2016 Honored Alumnus. Until his retirement in 2012, Hickey led Hickey Metal Fabrication during its growth from two employees in the 1950s to more than 100 employees at four Salem manufacturing facilities.

His business success facilitated his philanthropy. Hickey led his family to endow three named Salem High School Alumni Association scholarships in the past decade. (See page 2 for more on his speech.)

## 1966 Grads Add to Their Communities

Speaking on behalf of the 50-year reunion class, Dr. Joe Rottenborn '66 enumerated the careers of members of the Class of 1966. Without naming names he noted that a classmate sang on Broadway, another became a classical musician in San Francisco, and two others had pop music careers; 16 became educators including the current superintendent of the Salem schools; three became medical doctors and several were nurses; three became attorneys; four earned PhDs; one was mayor of Corpus Christi, Texas; and several have owned and operated businesses.

Rottenborn said: "Our classmates include a physicist, veterinarian, journalist, minister, state patrolman, Lordstown GMers, IT [information technology] administrator at ASU [Arizona State University],

## and the Grandview Cemetery manager.

"And many of our class carried out, perhaps, our society's most essential vocations: they became good citizens, friends, spouses, and parents—indeed, many had children graduate from Salem High. Of our 273-member graduating class, 72 still live in Salem and another 20 live within a short drive of our hometown.

"Today, 50 years after our 1966 graduation, we still have strong bonds, lasting friendships—and many great memories."

The Class of 1966's gift of \$26,766 to the association was announced by Ron Whitehill, vice president of the class who led fundraising for the class's 50-year reunion gift. He also announced the winner of the Class of 1966 Scholarship, which class members created with donations in excess of \$100,000 to mark their 40-year reunion in 2006.

#### Other Class Gifts

Speaking on behalf of the Class of 1956, which celebrated its 60-year reunion with three days of events in May, Rita Joseph O'Leary '56 announced its \$7,000 gift to the association.

Gary Greenisen '51 led the fundraising for the Class of 1951, which gave \$2,876 to the association. (See Page 14 for more about the Class of 1951 & 1956 reunions.)

Jarrod Polen, president of the Class of 2016, thanked the association on behalf of his classmates and announced their gift of \$1,000.

SHSAA President Shelley Miller Wilson '97 pointed out that among the 430 people attending the 135th reunion banquet were three alumnae who were celebrating their 84th, 83rd and 82nd graduation anniversaries, respectively. She then introduced Harriet McArtor Jackson '32, Matilda Hurray Tolson '33, and Constance Morgan Bricker '34. Evelyn Crawford Bichsel '36, who is marking the 80th anniversary of her graduation, sent a note stating she shared in the spirit of the gathering.

#### "The Magic of Scholarships"

As spokesman for the Class of 1946, Walter Ibele '46 pointed out that George Ansley Mitchell '46 was among the 18 classmates present at the banquet. Mitchell was one of three 1946 graduates who received an alumni association scholarship. He "parlayed" his \$250 scholarship to learn mechanical drawing at the Salem Trades School. Later he started a steel specialty company that continues to operate in Youngstown.

Noting that in the 1940s and 1950s the association, which started Ohio's first high school scholarship fund in 1903, had only enough money to give three scholarships annually, Ibele led the audience in a cheer for Salem and the Salem High School Alumni Association.

# Hickey tells grads to choose friends carefully, work hard & save money

As the 2016 Honored Alumnus, Bob Hickey '50 was the featured speaker at the 135th Annual Reunion and Banquet on May 21.

In his speech, Hickey referred to his family's modest financial circumstances when he was born and the experience of growing the business his father started in 1942. Hickey retired from the helm of Hickey Metal Fabrication in 2012; the company currently employs 180 people at four Salem manufacturing facilities.

"We have a fourth generation in the company and I am very proud of that. That doesn't happen too much," Hickey said. He was referring to his three grandsons—Nick A. Peters '98, Ben K. Peters, and Adam L. Hickey '06—who are involved in the company's leadership along with his son Leo P. Hickey '74 and daughter-in-law Suzanne Hickey. A fourth grandson Keith, a practicing attorney, resides in Ponte Vedra, FL, with his wife Noelle and son Ronan.

#### The beginning of SHSAA philanthropy

In his introduction, SHSAA Vice President Frank Zamarelli '82 thanked Hickey for his advocacy for and generosity toward the alumni association, and talked about Hickey's determination and hard work.

"The Salem community has been ever so blessed" by Hickey's decision to stay local.

"The reach of this company in Salem and the surrounding area is amazing: giving the opportunity to anyone willing to work and develop their skills in trades the option to create a career for themselves and their family," he said.

Then Zamarelli humorously described being summoned to meet Hickey on June 15, 2006. Business calls to Zamarelli, a vendor of Hickey Metal Fabrication, usually came from Leo Hickey or Lois Hickey Peters '77, Bob's daughter. Lois had a brief message for him: Dad wants to talk to you.

"I immediately wondered what was wrong," Zamarelli said. His anxiety grew as he waited in 90-degree heat for Bob. "Every minute seemed like an hour as I continued to watch Bob mow his lawn ...

"So eventually Bob finished mowing, jumped off his tractor, and came over to the gazebo and took the seat across from me. After wiping the perspiration from his brow with his bandana, he looked at me

and said, 'Frankie'—there are very few people who call me that, a few in this room yes—'Frankie, tell me how this alumni scholarship program works.'

"I proceeded to explain to Bob how the named scholarship program worked. And before I left that day Bob presented me with a check for \$100,000 to establish the first of several Hickey scholarships.

"The meeting lasted all of about five minutes, and when we finished, Bob excused himself to finish his yard work.

"Simply an amazing story for an amazing and dedicated individual," Zamarelli said to the hearty applause of the 430 people at the banquet.

#### Advice for SHS graduates

Hickey directed most of his brief remarks to the Salem High School seniors who graduated on May 29. "Starting out in life you have to work hard. Because if you don't work hard, you aren't going anywhere. You work hard and save money—you will be very successful."

To those "leaving the nest" Hickey said, "When you go to college learn one thing: pick who your friends are going to be that have the same values that you have because there are a lot of problems in this country today with drugs ... do not get involved in that because it can ruin your life, what you are going to do. You could even go to jail, and I don't think you want that."

He ended by saying, "I hope all you young people enjoy life as much as I have."

In the past ten years, Hickey has shown his strong support of the alumni association by leading his family's endowment of three named scholarships to help students pursue careers in trades, healthcare, and business. Those scholarships are the Hickey Metal Fabrication Vocational Scholarship, the Nancy Hickey Memorial Healthcare Scholarship, and the Lois A. Peters Memorial Business Scholarship.

Hickey and his family are also major contributors to the Salem schools, the Salem Elks, and the National Flag Truck.

#### Reflections of a "Hometown Boy"

During an interview, Hickey talked about his desire to go right to work after high school. He was thrilled that his parents gave him tools in a Kennedy tool box for graduation. He treasures them still.

Hickey's career began at the age of 11 when he started working for his dad's heating and roofing business. The 80 cents he earned per week was enough for a movie at the Grand Theater and a tidy addition to his savings account.

After serving in the U.S. Army in Korea, Hickey returned to Salem to work with his father, Leo R. Hickey. When his father died at the age of 50 in 1954, Bob Hickey took over the business. He had two employees. For many years his first wife, the late Nancy Howell Hickey '53, did the company's bookkeeping and other office work from their home.

"It hasn't been easy. We grew the busi-

ness and put the money back in the business," Hickey said, adding that he is grateful to the many friends who provided work for the company over the years.

Eventually their son Leo P. Hickey '74, their daughter the late Lois Hickey Peters '77, and Lois's husband Robert "Nick" Peters '73 took on various managerial roles.

In recent decades the company evolved into a job shop that fabricates products for the towing, trailer, and railroad industries as well as diverse local businesses.

Hickey said he never considered expanding anywhere other than Salem. It pleases him that the company continues to grow with people who live in and near Salem. "My roots are in Salem, so that is where I stayed," he said, pointing out that some employees have been with the company for 15, 20, and 25 years.

Hickey and his second wife, Karen, reside near the business in the Georgetown Road house he bought when the company was small. "I'm still a hometown boy," he said.



# Athletic Hall of Fame Inductees

The 2016 inductees into the Salem High School Athletic Hall of Fame are the 1929 SHS football team; Harry Baird '55; Greg Pshsniak '82; Paul Huzyak '88; Alyson Cotter Campbell '04; and Zac Grey '04.

Ed Votaw '53 is the 2016 Joe Kelley Spirit of Salem Award winner.

The induction will take place September 8 at the Salem Community Center, where the dinner tickets are being sold.

The undefeated 1929 Quaker Football team was the first Ohio squad to host an evening game under lights. Six thousand people attended that Oct. 11, 1929, game in Reilly Stadium. A game ball is at SHSAA.

Baird was basketball MVP two years and captain of the 14-4 squad of 1954-55.

Pshsniak excelled in football and track despite injuries. His senior year he competed at the state meet in the long jump and high jump.

Huzyak was just the fourth high school pole vaulter in state history to clear 16 feet when he did that in 1988. His college records at Ohio State still stand.

Campbell set SHS basketball records in three categories. Her senior year the team made it to the Division II final four contest after 25 regular-season wins.

Grey was a four-sport athlete who made school history as a football receiver. As a senior he made his track debut and went to the state finals as part of Salem's 400- and 800-meter relay teams.

Votaw, a SHS basketball and track standout, is being recognized for more than a half century of services as a track official. He began as a volunteer in the 1950s. He was a state licensed timer and starter from 1992 until he retired in 2014.

with the culture of a town like Salem, that is a very giving, very compassionate, very generous town—and it always has been and that's all it takes to get a lot of money for kids graduating from high school to go to college," lbele said. He explained afterward that he has been keen on scholarships since a Mullins scholarship enabled him to attend the University of Cincinnati.

Ibele also talked about another classmate: Daniel E. Smith, who died in 2014. The class's 70-year reunion on May 20 included a tribute to Smith, who was class president from freshman year on. "Dan has been our leader all along," Ibele said. Smith's gentle, outgoing personality kept them together over the years and his involvement in SHSAA made the organization a class priority. Smith attended 50 consecutive SHSAA annual banquets. Sharing in the challenges of World War II added to the bond among classmates; rationing of autos and gasoline meant all their high school socializing occurred in Salem, Ibele said.

Upon graduation the Class of 1946 gave the association \$825, which would be equivalent to \$10,164 in 2016. Over the years the class's reunion gifts to the association exceeded \$51,000. In 2006, 69 classmates contributed a total of \$36,046.46. This class gift is the largest the association has ever received from a class at its 60-year anniversary.

#### Update on SHSAA Finances

During the association's annual business meeting before the distribution of scholarships, SHSAA Treasurer Daniel T. Moore '95 reported the association's current fund balance is slightly more than \$9 million. The association spends 5% of the 12-quarter rolling average of the investment portfolio's value to fund scholarships and its office operations. The scholarships awarded in 2016 ranged from \$470 for the band camp students to \$6,800 for the seniors graduating with the highest grade point averages.

"To our supporters: Your continued contributions are a direct investment in every award recipient's future. This year 101 students will receive a jumpstart in their education thanks to your support," Moore said.
